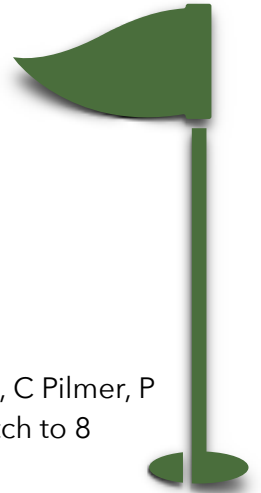
HANDICAP MATCHPLAY PENNANTS 2026:

HANDICAPPING SYSTEM:

Taken from a club newsletter where they were undertaking a handicap review of their players - makes some interesting points. Is this how you are playing golf with regards to maintaining a fair handicap?

Fair handicapping depends on full and accurate information.

There are two basic premises that underlie the Handicap System:

- It requires all players to make the best score at every hole in every round, regardless of where the round is played
- That players post every acceptable round for peer review.

We occasionally get asked why an adjustment may happen outside of the automated handicap process. There is often justification for adjusting a player's handicap index, with some examples below:

- A regular winner in competition
- An obvious difference between competition play and general play scores
- A player posting erroneous scores
- Stopping play early to avoid posting scores
- Repeatedly playing more than one ball to avoid posting scores
- Deliberately reporting / recording more or fewer strokes than actually taken
- Deliberately taking extra strokes to inflate a score
- Improving faster than the handicap formula can respond
- Entering an increased number of 9-hole scores to remove counting scores
- Physical or health ailments
